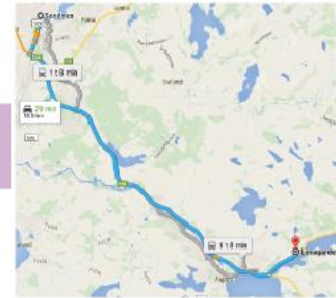

## About Limagarden:

The farm has been around since the 1600s. Sheep have always been one of the main industries on the farm.

In addition they were fishing trout, whitefish and char in Limavatnet and Flassavatnet. Fishing nets were tied by hand. In the forge they made sheep bells and later ice skates. Clogs were carved by hand in wood.

The farm was also one of them first in the district who got a washstand for sheep. Sheep farmers from neighboring farms came in October and November with their flocks to bath sheep in soap to kill ticks. It was told that it lay many sheep flocks along the road up to the garden and waited on a bath at this time.

Wool was an important resource. The cottage was used for fine occasions and in the floor there were used a plank. In the attic of the house you will find a small exhibition about the tool, which and working methods in connection with production of wool.


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
